A blend of Bordeaux varieties that seeks to faithfully express the Puente Alto terroir and that pays tribute to the family legacy that gave rise to the tradition and heritage of Concha y Toro and of Chile's modern wine industry. H-4 BV Beaulieu Vineyard *Tapestry Reserve* (**93pts**) 2017 *Napa Valley* (*California*) A blend of 86% Cabernet Sauvignon, 5% Malbec, 4% Petit Verdot, 3% Merlot and 2% Cabernet Franc.

A blend of 86% Cabernet Sauvignon, 5% Malbec, 4% Petit Verdot, 3% Merlot and 2% Cabernet Franc. It was aged in French oak, 60% new, for 22 months. It comes galloping out of the glass with energetic fruity scents of crushed black plus, mulberries, redcurrants and blackberries plus suggestions of camphor, cinnamon stick and chocolate box. - B-15 Dunn Vineyards Cabernet Sauvignon (**96pts**) 2017 Howell Mountain (California) \$399 The 2017 Cabernet Sauvignon Howell Mountain is sure to make Dunn fans happy. Powerful and ample, it marries the natural intensity of the year with the savoriness that makes Howell Mountain Cabernets so distinctive. Dark blue/purplish fruit, graphite, spice, leather, dried herbs and lavender imbue the 2017 with striking intensity and character.
- I-5 Orin Swift Mercury Head Cabernet Sauvignon (96pts) 2021 Napa Valley (California) \$299

 An almost-black, opaque garnet core sits in the glass with slow-moving tears falling down the sides. Immediate aromatic notes of ripe cassis, charred ribeye, sandalwood and freshly cut oak pilfer breathe deeper for more. The first sip is a complex, layered conundrum of blackberry, black plum, fennel, licorice and dark chocolate. More sips peel back the layers to reveal a rich and balanced wine with a deep cassis core. A sweet linger on the finish closes the wine with softly textured chalky tannins.

- K-3 Shafer One Point Five Cabernet Sauvignon 2019 Napa Valley (California) \$249
 This Stag's Leap District Cabernet offers aromas and flavors of bright black cherry, red currant, cranberry, lavender, allspice, and crushed herbs. All this lush, vivid fruit is seamlessly brought together with ripe, cashmere-like tannins

- G-3 Alexander's Crown by Rodney Strong 2016 Alexander Valley (California) \$179

 Ripe flavors of black currant, blackberries and violets. The wine is voluptuous, has a rich mouthfeel, soft tannins and a long lingering finish with notes of dried herbs and a touch of mocha.
- G-1 Post Parade Stretch Drive (95pts) 2014 Napa (California) \$149
 This wine oozes with provocative dark berries laced with crushed rock, cocoa and baking spices. It's made by Thomas Rivers Brown, whom you may recognize from Schrader, Revana, GTS, Maybach, Gemstone and Outpost. Brown made history as the first American winemaker to receive a perfect 100 Point score from the Wine Spectator, & has had more than a dozen 100 Point wines in his career.
- J-12 QUILT by Joseph Wagner (94pts) 2019 Napa Valley (California) \$129

 Deep, dark brick red to blood plum. A seamless blend of crème de cassis, hazelnut, cocoa, blackberry preserves, a charry meat toastiness, dark fruits and blackberry pie along with suggestions of dark licorice, stewed rhubarb, strawberry, spice and vanillin. Rich and satisfying with chocolate brownie, yogurt, molasses, brown sugar and rhubarb notes presented in perfect balance with higher-toned fruit emphasis.
