Sparkling, Cider, & Champagne

- Q-1 Veuve Clicquot Yellow Label *Champagne* (94pts) NV Reims (Champagne, France) \$180
Lemony richness on the nose. Toffee-apple on the palate with a live, creamy mousse with flavors of white cherry, ginger, and acidity.
- Q-2 GH Mumm Grand Cordon Brut Rose (91pts) NV Reims (Champagne, France) \$149
This creamy rosé is round and balanced, with a bright backbone of snappy acidity driving flavors of candied pink grapefruit zest, toasted brioche, melon +and spice.
- Q-3 Peter Brum Goldsparkler 24 Carat Gold NV Germany \$60
Light and elegant in style, what makes it really distinctive is that it contains fine flakes of 24-carat gold leaf, designed to highlight its natural effervescence.
- Q-5 Neige Bubble Sparkling Apple Wine NV Canada \$45
Produced using the traditional method, this naturally sparkling cider is dosed with Neige Premiere apple ice wine which makes it unique, special, refreshing and delicate! The bubbles are fine, sharp and generous. Pure and clean, the aromas remind one of fresh apple and white flower. Delightfully light and a perfect balance of sugar and acidity.
- Q-6 Freixenet Gran Seleccion Extra Dry Cava NV Spain \$30
Crisp, clean and a fresh palate of apple, ripe pear, and bright citrus with a hint of ginger.

Chardonnay

- R-4 Cakebread (92pts) 2021 Napa (California) \$99
Aromas of ripe golden apple, white peach, and light oak. On the palate, apple and pear characteristics are balanced by fresh acidity, and the finish is clean, with appealing hints of apple and lemon intermingling with notes of minerality
- R-6 Duckhorn (92pts) 2022 Napa (California) \$75
Aromas of lemon cream, orange blossom, Key lime and candied pineapple. On the palate, a lush, silky mouthfeel and energetic acidity frame lively orchard-fruit flavors of pear and white peach, with hints of brioche emerging on the long, focused finish.

Sancerre/Sauvignon Blanc

- R-8 Cave des Vines de Sancerre *Les Tuilieres* 2022 Sancerre \$99
The wine reflects the terroir wonderfully. The flavors are bright with lime, mineral, passion fruit, and that wonderful chalkiness one wants from a Sancerre.
- R-9 Maison Lispaul 2022 Sancerre \$99
This wine is fragrant, fresh and juicy with a slight grassy edge. Crisp & packed with zesty, citrus fruit & green apple flavors.
- R-11 Domaine de la Foret Gasselín 2022 Sancerre \$99
The palate is fruity, well-balanced and offers a juicy/acidulous frame, minerality, a small gourmandize as well as a small flowery side, a fine tension, a certain juiciness and a very finely tight grain.

Sake

- R-1 Tozai *Snow Maiden* Junmai Nigori (720ml) 2021 Japan \$30
Bright and fresh with a lovely ricey and fruity combination. Flavors of honeydew melon, raw pumpkin, and radish. Creamy texture and full body. Pairs great with spicy food.
- R-2 Tozai *Blossom of Peace* Plum (720ml) 2021 Japan \$30
Aromas of almond and marzipan followed by plum, apricot, and cherry on the palate. The soft tartness and acidity balance the finish with a slightly sweet smoothness.
- R-3 Shiokawa *Cowboy Yamahai* Junmai Gingo Genshu (720ml) 2021 Japan \$60
The nose on this storied sake is a collection of musky fruits, straw, steamed rice, and caramel elements. Howdy Partner! And welcome to a super full-bodied sake that appeals to big red wine drinkers. Complex, layered, saucy, deep, rich, bold, ricey this Cowboy is the real deal. With an 19% alcohol content this vast and savory sake is a real mouthful that is as smooth as it is solid.

Italian Reds

- D-1 Argiolas Turriga (**90pts**) 2008 *Isola Dei Nuraghi IGT (Sardinia)* \$179
 On the nose, black cherries & wild blueberries. Herbal notes of thyme & a subtle hint of eucalyptus & wood forest tones. On the palate, the combination of the woody forest floor, with the herbal tones taking first place. The fruits come into play but ever so mildly, just the cherries & a slight violet introduction, then a strong dark chocolate & followed with a punch of pepper. Leather comes into the show for a moment. Wonderous dry long tannins.
- A-6 Agricola Punica *Montessu* (**93pts**) 2019 *Isola Dei Nuraghi IGT (Sardinia)* \$79
 Grown in the clay and limestone soils of southwest Sardinia, this Carignanobased red sees the addition of some Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Syrah, and Cab Franc. It begins with tarry chocolate notes and a layer of topsoil lined with blackberry and black pepper. Teeth-gripping notes of anise and dark plum form an intriguing, dense mouthfeel on the finish. Aged for 12 months in French oak
- K-1 Bortoluzzi Cabernet Sauvignon 2013 *Venezia Giulia IGT (Italy)* \$75
 Grown in the clay and limestone soils of southwest Sardinia, this Carignanobased red sees the addition of some Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Syrah, and Cab Franc. It begins with tarry chocolate notes and a layer of topsoil lined with blackberry and black pepper. Teeth-gripping notes of anise and dark plum form an intriguing, dense mouthfeel on the finish. Aged for 12 months in French oak

Pinot Noir

- A-11 Whetstone *Jon Boat* 2014 *Sonoma Coast (California)* \$135
 A complex nose of Bing cherry, saffras tea, ripe cranberry, fig jam, watermelon, soy, and Asian spices. Medium bodied flavors of Bing cherry, strawberry rhubarb pie, and orange pekoe tea are coupled with savory hints of Loganberry followed by supple tannins.
- Wall Carabella (**93pts**) 2011 *Chehalem Mountains (Oregon)* \$119
 Complex red fruit and plum, very old school pinot nose, and very supple, complex tannins. If you are focused on bigger, riper robust style pinots, this is probably not a good choice. However, if you fancy something light and easy to drink, this is the Pinot for you.
- L-1 Patz & Hall (**92pts**) 2017 *Sonoma Coast (California)* \$119
 This is an approachable Pinot Noir with fine-grained tannins, freshness and purity. Intense aromas of Bing cherry, strawberry, carnation flowers and licorice notes pour from the glass. Though nicely dense and full on the palate, the wine avoids heaviness with fresh acidity and bright red fruit flavors that resolve on a long, detailed finish.
- B-5 Panthera (**91pts**) 2019 *Sonoma Coast (California)* \$119
 Made by Hess Vineyard, this wine is brazenly rich, yet it stays refined and elegant. A hint of wood and liquorice round it out nicely, with strawberry, plum, baking spice, and earth on the palate.
- A-5 Chamisal Vineyards *Califa Selection* (**90pts**) 2010 *Edna Valley (California)* \$119
 The wine boasts an expressive nose dominated by cranberry, raspberries and red plum, with ample underlying varietal notes of ripe stems, warm spice and earth. Bright red fruit flavors define the palate with fresh acidity, a seamless structure and a lifted strawberry character from the whole cluster fermentation
- H-2 DeLoach Marin County 2013 *North Coast (California)* \$109
 This captivating Pinot Noir opens with enticing red berry aromas and hints of cocoa. Upon the palate, ripe, rich flavors of strawberry and raspberry with a touch of vanilla offer succulent, soft tannins and well-balance acidity that leads to a long finish
- B-10 tePa The Reserve Collection 2017 *Marlborough (New Zealand)* \$109
 Complex aromas of red fruit, anise, violets, and tobacco lead to a plush palate with fine chalky tannins on the finish.
- C-1 Belle Glos *Eulenloch* (**90pts**) 2021 *Napa Valley (California)* \$99
 A spicy pinot with dark cherries, dark raspberries and tree bark. Flavorful on the palate, with some oak spices and dried herbs. Firm, but quite polished.
- A-17 Mer Soleil Reserve (**90pts**) 2018 *Santa Lucia Highlands (California)* \$99
 From the Wagner family, makers of Caymus, the nose on this wine is undeniably Santa Lucia Highlands - a wet stone minerality and subtle oceanic character evoke fresh breezes off the Pacific, signaling this wine's cool coastal origin. Opening texture of slight graphite awakens every part of the palate. Entry is fresh, yet integrated with mouth-filling creaminess. On the finish, toasted bread notes balance the wisp of natural acidity and cherry tarte echoing the nose.
- J-1 DeLoach *Green Valley* 2012 *Sonoma (California)* ~~\$99~~ \$69
 Opens with alluring aromas of cherry cola, currant and sandalwood. Richly complex flavors of cherry, ripe raspberry, licorice and tobacco coat the palate of this full bodied, well-structured wine that culminates in a long, satisfying finish.

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| B-7 | <i>Etude Grace Benoist Ranch (90pts)</i> | 2016 | <i>Carneros (California)</i> | \$89 |
| | A vibrant red ruby color, with red berry fruit flavors, along with the signature cinnamon graham cracker spice found in Etude Pinot Noirs. Appealing & bright, alongside delicate mineral earth & spice notes, followed by a lush mouthfeel & silky tannins. | | | |
| K-5 | <i>Rossi Wallace (91pts)</i> | 2014 | <i>Napa (California)</i> | \$89 \$69 |
| | From Atlas Peak sites, this is a dark, brooding wine rich in earthy loam, pomegranate, cranberry and cherry that carries a fistful of weight and power and warm, smoky oak. | | | |
| E-13 | <i>Roco Gravel Road (90pts)</i> | NV | <i>Willamette Valley (Oregon)</i> | \$79 |
| | This 100% Pinot Noir is a blend of Pommard, Dijon, and Wadenswil clones from the winemaker's favorite Willamette vineyards and is a conjunction of 2019 and 2020 vintage. Aromas and flavors of blackberries, black fruits and leather. | | | |
| E-7 | <i>Silvan Ridge</i> | 2014 | <i>Willamette Valley (Oregon)</i> | \$75 |
| | This smooth and detailed wine mixes tart red fruits with earthy, lightly charred flavors. The robust tannins carry notes of espresso beans and dark chocolate. | | | |
| D-12 | <i>Sean Minor Point North</i> | 2015 | <i>Willamette Valley (Oregon)</i> | \$69 |
| | Fruit-forward and easygoing, with appealing cherry and spice flavors. It's lightly fruity with strawberries and a hint of sweet spice. | | | |
| C-17 | <i>Hawkins Cellars</i> | 2014 | <i>Eola-Amity Hills (Oregon)</i> | \$59 |
| | Meat, leather, cranberry and coffee on the nose lead to dark cherry, black licorice and coffee grounds on the palate. | | | |
| E-1 | <i>Merriman Cummins Road</i> | 2013 | <i>Yamhill-Carlton (Oregon)</i> | \$59 |
| | Strawberry fruit, framed in orange peel, characterizes this simple, yet enjoyable wine, from first sip to the last. It's forward and fruity, with a short tail. | | | |
| D-16 | <i>Lucas & Lewellen</i> | 2015 | <i>Santa Barbara (California)</i> | \$59 |
| | This wine shows exuberant aromas of baked cherry, gingerbread, clove, cardamom and vanilla on the rich, heady nose. It tightens up on the sip to focus on thyme, oregano, rose petals and potpourri flavors, though the vanilla and cherry do flash on the finish. | | | |
| D-4 | <i>The Forager</i> | 2016 | <i>Sonoma Coast (California)</i> | \$59 |
| | A Pinot Noir that illustrates that careful, experienced selection, blending and maturation of Pinot Noir lots grown in diverse coastal locations can deliver delicious flavors and interest. Classic low-impact Burgundian winemaking techniques and careful maturation in top new French oak capture the typicity of these sites - and the purity of this noble red grape variety. | | | |

Malbec

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| I-7 | <i>Titus Malbec</i> | 2013 | <i>Napa Valley (California)</i> | \$179 |
| | Balanced tannins and bright acidity give the wine a plush mouthfeel and long finish. Flavors of bing cherry, plum jam, clove, vanilla and warm cedar dominate the palate. | | | |
| E-11 | <i>Moffett Malbec</i> | 2013 | <i>Napa (California)</i> | \$135 |
| | Hints of pepper and blackberry with vanilla afterthought. | | | |
| E-8 | <i>Red Schooner Voyage II Malbec by Caymus</i> | NV | <i>Andes Mountains (Argentina)</i> | \$119 |
| | Grapes for this Malbec are grown in the Argentina, then transported by ocean voyage to Caymus, to create a style that is dense, dark and supple. Falling outside standard labeling rules, Red Schooner does not include a vintage date but is known by the voyage from which it traveled (i.e. Voyage 11 is the 2021 vintage). Strikingly smooth, with scents and flavors of dark fruit and fine, textural tannins. | | | |
| C-11 | <i>Pedernales Cellars Six Generations</i> | 2018 | <i>Stonewall (Texas)</i> | \$60 |
| | Malbec in Texas produces a wine that is quite different from what most folks think about when they think Malbec. The fruit and wines produced here are closer stylistically to French Malbec rather than the high octane Argentinian style. In good years, Malbec can give nice dark fruit notes, earth, and offers a lovely purple hue which is one of the easy markers of a Malbec. | | | |

Merlot

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| A-9 | <i>Emmolo Merlot (91pts)</i> | 2019 | <i>Napa Valley (California)</i> | \$139 |
| | This wine is not your average Merlot. You'll be excited to know that this wine is crafted by Jennifer Wagner, daughter of Chuck Wagner, the founder of Caymus Vineyards. It is heavier and opens with a mild ripe blackberry bouquet with hints of coffee. On the palate, this wine is full bodied, rich and extracted. The finish is dry and its flavors and big tannins are quite lengthy. | | | |
| G-1 | <i>Galil Mountain Merlot</i> | 2015 | <i>Galilee (Israel)</i> | \$49 |
| | A deep, glowing Bordeaux color that gives a unique cylindrical expression of a rich fruit aroma in the background with aromas of fresh herbs, cloves and tobacco. | | | |

French Style Reds

- J-4 Neyers *Left Bank Red (92pts)* 2019 *St Helena (California)* \$119
Left Bank Red has that familiar old-world, wild berry charm, and pairs it with attractive elements of cherry, cedar, and minerality. Blend: 55% Merlot, 45% Cabernet Sauvignon
- E-5 Austin Hope Mourvedre 2015 *Paso Robles (California)* \$119
Nose of prunes, raisin cake and dusty earth with hints of cinnamon stick and dark chocolate. Full-bodied, concentrated and packed with dried berries and exotic spice notions, it offers a chewy frame and just enough freshness, finishing long
- B-2 Austin Hope Grenache 2016 *Paso Robles (California)* \$99
Deep ruby in color, the 2016 Austin Hope Grenache has classic aromas of dark black cherry, herbaceous hints of anise, and fresh rose petals. On the palate, rich flavors of leather and smoke are balanced by luscious, dried cherries and blueberries.
- Floor Tuck Beckstoffer Melee Grenache 2016 *Oakville (California)* \$75
Hints of baked summer fruits, white pepper, lavender, underbrush and dry aged meats lead to an incredibly focused, yet elegant, balanced and graceful mid-palate. The finish is a blockbuster that exudes both power and finesse.

Syrah, Shiraz, & Petite Sirah

- D-8 Caymus-Suisun *Grand-Durif* Petite Sirah 2021 *Fairfield (California)* \$139
Separated from Napa by just an invisible county line, Suisun Valley (which became an AVA in 1982) is still largely undiscovered. Durif is synonymous with Petite Sirah, the widely grown grape in the region – Caymus-Suisun added "Grand" to the name for its grand style. With harmonious tannins, this wine is opulent, luxuriously soft and totally enjoyable.
- B-12 Staton Vineyards Petite Sirah 2011 *St Helena, Napa (California)* \$119
Dark and inky, with flavors of plum, blackberry, pomegranate and fig, the tannins have mellowed somewhat to reveal a lushness that carries through to the last sip.
- M-4 Smith Wooten Petite Sirah 2016 *Sierra Foothills (California)* \$109
Rich and opulent, with aromas of blackberries, lavender and baking spices. Deep and complex flavors black cherry, plums and black pepper build on the palate. There is nothing petite about this wine as its well structured and firm tannins lead to a long lingering finish.
- D-11 Penfolds *Bin 2* Shiraz Mataro 2017 *South Australia* \$89
Also known as monastrell or mourvèdre, mataro was introduced to Australia in the 1830s. A delightfully complex amalgam of savoury green olives, pepperoni with a hint of sweet/salty Dutch liquorice. Soft blue fruits to the fore with textured tannins providing grip.
- L-5 Saldo Shiraz by *The Prisoner* 2021 *Australia* \$79
Highly complex aromas of crushed herb, brine, and dark fruit dominated by blackberry and blueberry with hints of black currant. Flavors of mixed, juicy dark berries and hints of cocoa on the palate.

Zinfandel

- C-7 Saldo Zinfandel by *The Prisoner* 2021 *Oakville (California)* \$89
Dark ruby color with bold aromas of black licorice, black pepper, cherry, and baking spice. The entry is rich, full, and scintillating. The palate is mouthwatering and smooth with a hint of chocolate. The finish is voluptuous with soft, velvety tannins.
- WALL Easton Zinfandel 2011 *Shenandoah Valley (California)* \$79
A beautiful bottling that will prosper with time, easily until 2024, this grippy, earthy Zin offers soft plum and brambly blackberry amid a pretty, floral nose and plenty of peppery anise and earth.

Red Blends

- C-5 **Shafer Relentless (98pts)** 2018 *Napa Valley* \$229
 A blend of 94% Syrah and 6% Petite Sirah, the 2018 Relentless looks to be just about sensational, offering a dense purple color as well as rich, loaded notes of blackberries, currants, smoked meats, peppery spice, and violets. Gamy, exotic character paired with beautiful richness, it has fabulous purity, ripe, polished tannins, and a great finish.
- C-3 **Trefethen Dragon's Tooth** 2019 *Napa (California)* \$169
 40% Malbec, 32% Petit Verdot, 23% Cabernet Sauvignon, 5% Merlot
 Bold, dark fruit aromas of blackberry, plum, and boysenberry are complemented by notes of clove, nutmeg, and cedar. Generous on the palate, the lively acidity and youthful tannins add depth and energy, leading to a long, concentrated finish.
- J-6 **Marques de Casa Concha Heritage** 2020 *Puente Alto (Chile)* \$149
 A blend of Bordeaux varieties that seeks to faithfully express the Puente Alto terroir and that pays tribute to the family legacy that gave rise to the tradition and heritage of Concha y Toro and of Chile's modern wine industry. Deep, dark red in color with lush flavors of cherries, blackcurrants, blackberries, cedar, and a bit of black tar. It shows a tremendous concentration of flavors and a smooth, almost silky texture framed by a firm tannic structure that truly stands out at the beginning of the long finish.
- H-4 **BV Beaulieu Vineyard Tapestry Reserve (93pts)** 2017 *Napa Valley (California)* \$149
 86% Cabernet Sauvignon, 5% Malbec, 4% Petit Verdot, 3% Merlot and 2% Cabernet Franc.. It comes galloping out of the glass with energetic fruity scents of crushed black plus, mulberries, redcurrants and blackberries plus suggestions of camphor, cinnamon stick and chocolate box. The full-bodied palate is rich and decadently fruited, offering up tons of black fruit preserves and spicy layers with a taut yet approachable frame.
- E-3 **Lion Tamer by Hess** 2018 *Napa Valley (California)* \$119
 47% Malbec, 24% Zinfandel, 19% Petite Sirah, 8% Cabernet Sauvignon, 1% Petit Verdot, 1% Carignan.
 This red blend brings all of the intensity of Napa Valley fruit and, with Malbec at the core of the blend, produces a lush wine that presents juicy, black fruit and a velvety texture.
- D-6 **Zorzal Eggo Tinto de Tiza (92pts)** 2014 *Mendoza (Argentina)* \$89
 A blend of Malbec, Cabernet Franc, and Cabernet Sauvignon, fermented and aged in concrete. Deep, intense and complex, with the aromas typical of Gualtallay, such as chalk, wet cement and minerals. Great structure and volume and a silky body with textured tannins, the acidity gives plenty of freshness.
- J-8 **Francis Ford Coppola Director's Cut Cinema Red** 2019 *Sonoma (California)* \$89
 Aromas of fresh red fruit, wild berries, lightly toasted pastries, and floral notes, as well as flavors of red currant, cherry, and cola. 50.7% Zinfandel, 32.6% Cabernet Sauvignon, 11.2% Petite Syrah, 5.5% Other Reds
- I-17 **Vina Tvelde Vendimia** 2017 *Ribera del Duero (Spain)* \$69
 Made from 100% Tempranillo, this classic Ribera del Duero wine is full-bodied with firm tannins and medium to high acidity. Classic flavor notes include blackberry, cassis, plum, red berries, vanilla, spice, leather, and tobacco. A complex, structured wine with lively acidity and great potential to develop over time.
- B-3 **Quest by Austin Hope** 2021 *Paso Robles (California)* \$69
 Quest is unique expression of this Cabernet Sauvignon and Cabernet Franc blend. On the nose, refreshing notes of menthol, fresh cedar, and a dusting of coco. The flavors evolve on the palette to display crisp winter green mint, dark chocolate, lush vanilla, and a touch of cooking spice. As the flavor evolves the soft supple tannins linger leaving behind a hint of evergreen.
- E-14 **Trinity Hill The Trinity (91ps)** 2014 *Hawkes Bay (New Zealand)* \$59
 The name is misleading, this contains five grape varieties (55% Merlot, 17% Tempranillo, 13% Cabernet Sauvignon, 8% Malbec, 7% Syrah). A lush, expansive wine filled with dark fruit: think cassis and blueberry. Hints of mocha and baking spices linger on the finish.
- J-10 **Eola Hills Red Blend** NV *Rickreall (Oregon)* \$59
 This bold wine is a blend of Zinfandel, Sangiovese, Merlot and Pinot Noir from three states –Oregon, Washington and California. The wine opens with aromas of intense fruitiness that lead into a soft and smooth palate with flavors of red berry jam. A portion of proceeds from each bottle goes towards supporting veterans and first-responders.

Cabernet Sauvignon

- B-15 **Dunn Vineyards Cabernet Sauvignon (96pts)** 2017 *Howell Mountain (California)* \$399
 The 2017 Cabernet Sauvignon Howell Mountain is sure to make Dunn fans happy. Powerful and ample, it marries the natural intensity of the year with the savoriness that makes Howell Mountain Cabernets so distinctive. Dark blue/purplish fruit, graphite, spice, leather, dried herbs and lavender imbue the 2017 with striking intensity and character.
- G-4 **PlumpJack Estate Cabernet Sauvignon** 2019 *Napa (California)* \$375
 Juicy blackberry, dark plum, boysenberry, and muddled raspberries, blended with notes of cardamom, cinnamon, molasses, and sage to create a gorgeous silky entry. It's beautifully structured with finely integrated, velvety tannin, and an exceptionally long finish.
- F-3 **Shafer *One Point Five* Cabernet Sauvignon** 2021 *Napa (California)* \$299
 One Point Five is Shafer's signature Cabernet Sauvignon, reflecting the timeless elegance of top Napa Valley vineyards. This wine honors the founding partnership of John and Doug Shafer, who said they'd worked together so long theirs wasn't a second-generation story but a generation and a half. The long, sunny 2021 summer created idyllic growing season. The fruit developed rich color with clean, elegant, and pure aromas and flavors.
- H-3 **CADE Estate Cabernet Sauvignon** 2019 *Howell Mountain (California)* \$289
 Intoxicating aromas of cedar, rose, and black cherry, with blackberry, cassis, & chocolate on the finish.
- J-16 **Silver Oak Cabernet Sauvignon (96pts)** 2017 *Napa (California)* \$249
 This is a big upgrade in finesse & clarity to such a popular, premium cabernet from Napa. It shows lots of blackberry, tar, cedar and oak-tree aromas that follow through to a full yet toned palate of fine, integrated tannins & a vivid finish. Owner David Duncan explained that the American oak they use in the wine for aging now comes 100% from their own barrel-making facilities
- C-13 **Caymus Cabernet Sauvignon 1 LITER BOTTLE** 2021 *Napa (California)* \$249
 Caymus has a signature style that is dark in color, with rich fruit and ripe tannins – as approachable in youth as in maturity. Since its founding in 1972, Caymus has become renowned as a consistent leader in the production of Napa Valley Cabernet. This Cabernet offers layered, lush aromas and flavors, including cocoa, cassis and ripe berries.
- F-4 **Chimney Rock *Stags Leap District* (93pts)** 2019 *Napa Valley (California)* \$229
 This Stag's Leap District Cabernet is aged 18 months in 50% new French oak, the wood is relatively restrained here, adding just hints of cedar and vanilla to the raspberry, cassis and cherry aromas. Medium to full-bodied, supple and silky, this is a fun, easy-to-drink Cabernet for drinking over the next decade.
- D-5 **Stags' Leap Cabernet Sauvignon (93pts)** 2021 *Napa Valley (California)* \$199
 This elegant wine is plush and inviting with generous dark berry fruit flavors and integrated notes of violet, clove and cedar.

Fun Fact: Stags' Leap is different than Stag's Leap. Many people confuse these two vineyards but look closely.... Both make great wine and both were founded in the Stags Leap district of Napa. Both have similar price points. Both wanted to honor the area where their wine was made and where the grapes were grown to make their wines. They both did so by taking on the name of the district. The only difference is the placement of the apostrophe. Stag's Leap Wine Cellars is known for the 1973 Cabernet that won the award in Paris. The Stags' Leap Winery has an even older history and was originally established in 1872, it is also well-known for excellent wines, including some longstanding Petite Sirahs. So why are the two allowed to exist? Anyone could be fooled into thinking their drinking wine from one winery and one winery alone. Their logos are so similar that it would be hard not to think anything else; in fact, most people don't know that the two wineries are different.
- I-9 **Stag's Leap *Artemis* Cabernet Sauvignon (93pts)** 2021 *Napa Valley (California)* \$199
 Inviting aromas of boysenberry, plum, currant, chocolate and baking spice. The rich entrance leads to a fresh and flavorful mid-palate.
- I-13 **Shafer *TD9* Cabernet Sauvignon** 2021 *Napa Valley (California)* \$189
 Yes, TD9 used to be a red blend. It is in its first vintage as a Cabernet Sauvignon, and it fills the glass with irresistible aromas and flavors of fresh black cherries, black currant, red plum, thyme, rose petal, and cocoa. Lush and mouth-filling, this 2021 offers the kind of complexity and structure that ensures many years of enjoyment ahead.
- G-3 **Alexander's Crown by *Rodney Strong*** 2016 *Alexander Valley (California)* \$179
 Ripe flavors of black currant, blackberries and violets. The wine is voluptuous, has a rich mouthfeel, soft tannins and a long lingering finish with notes of dried herbs and a touch of mocha.
- I-11 **Caymus *California* Cabernet Sauvignon** 2022 *Fairfield (California)* \$149
Not to be confused with their Hallmark, original Napa Cabernet, this is a small, new inaugural release from Caymus Vineyards. A California-appellation Cabernet Sauvignon – supple, dark and rich, bearing the signature hallmarks of Caymus, it is sourced from sites throughout the state which feature climatic conditions, soils & topography that are ideally suited to Cabernet. This project stems from excitement over California's diverse vineyard land, often in lesser-known areas, with great potential for another great Caymus wine.
